What is it?

Why?

The college affordability journey does not start in 12th grade. In our years of partnering with schools and serving students, we've learned how much early college awareness, options, and costs could **improve future outcomes for students.**

This series of workshops is designed to help bridge that critical gap. Since the workshop series is open-source, we intend for it to reach many students across Massachusetts and beyond through their committed practitioners.

Who is it for?

This curriculum is designed for **practitioners who work directly with middle school (grades 7 and 8) and high school students (grades 9-11) and their families** in the classroom or other settings. It's also ideal for practitioners who aren't necessarily experts themselves on college affordability and financial aid.

The materials include facilitator-guided lesson plans and in-class activities to keep students engaged. **The entire series is available at no charge to educators, nonprofits, and community-based organizations.**
