


Colleges and universities that meet full need

Each college/university has their own calculation for determining how much financial aid a student needs in order to attend their school. The financial aid provided can include: scholarships, grants, loans, and work study.



Each school on this list guarantees to provide the full amount of financial aid they determine a student needs.

Understanding the list

- Two asterisks (**) indicates a school that meets full need AND will not include any loans in the student's financial aid offer, no matter what their income is.
- One asterisk (*) indicates a school that meets full need and will not include any loans in a student's financial aid offer IF the student's family meets certain income requirements (amount indicated in parenthesis), usually assuming typical assets.
- One up caret (^) indicates a school does NOT meet full need for students who are undocumented, or have DACA or TPS

Note: While this information is accurate and up-to-date to the best of uAspire's knowledge, we recommend the student confirm this directly with the schools to which they are applying, especially if the student has a special circumstance (such as being undocumented or applying as a transfer student)! This list may not be fully inclusive, and policies indicated may come with additional stipulations. Always be sure to contact the college or university directly to find out if a student is eligible.
